UK Blue Carbon Evidence Partnership **Privacy Notice**

This privacy notice sets out what you can expect from Cefas when we process your personal information. This is complemented by our <u>personal information charter</u>, which broadly sets out our standards for requesting or storing personal information.

What data do we collect?

The information that we collect from you includes:

- Name
- Address & Postcode
- Email address
- Career history, etc. as contained within your CV
- Other personal information volunteered in your application

Why are we processing your personal data?

The UKBCEP has been established as a cross-government partnership to enhance communication around blue carbon across the administrations. The chair recruitment is expected to run between 22nd November 2022 to the end of February 2023. Applicants will be asked to provide an EOI and a CV, which is expected to contain personal information. This information will be assessed by the secretariat and shared with 3 members of the Partnership from across government in order to assess applicants' capabilities for the role. As part of the process we will also carry due diligence, details of which are explained in the application pack. We will also use your information to contact you on the progress of your application.

What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Article 6 legal basis for processing your data is it is necessary for the **performance of a contract** and that the processing is necessary for the **performance of a task** in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.

Cefas was created in 1997 as an executive agency of Defra to provide scientific advice and fulfil the functions of the Secretary of State for Defra. Cefas provides critical science evidence and advice that underpins Defra policy development tackling the most pressing challenges for our marine and freshwater environment, including fisheries management, climate change, pollution and biodiversity loss.

Who will we share your personal data with?

We will share your information with partners from Defra, The Environment Agency, The Scottish Government and St. Andrews University who make up the sift panel.

Will your data be processed in a country outside of the United Kingdom or European Economic Area (EEA)?

Your information will not be shared, transferred or processed outside of the EEA.

Will your data be processed using automated decision making or profiling?

Your information will not be processed using automated decision making or profiling.

How long will we keep your data for?

The process is expected to conclude by May 2023 and information may be retained for up to 12 months from collection.

What are the consequences if I do not supply the requested data?

If you do not supply the requested personal data, it is more than likely that we will not be able to process your application.

What are my rights to my personal data?

Your rights and our commitments to your personal data are described in the <u>Cefas Personal</u> <u>Information Charter</u> as well as on the <u>ICO website</u>.

Where processing of your personal data is necessary for **entry into or performance of a contract**, you have the right to:

- Be Informed when we are processing your information
- To access and request a copy of the information we hold about you
- To correct inaccurate or complete incomplete personal data we hold about you
- Be forgotten, and request for us to erase your personal data
- To request that we restrict how widely we process your personal data
- To request we send your structured personal data to another controller
- To request human intervention where automated decision making or profiling

Where processing of your personal data is necessary for the **performance of a task in the public interest** or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller, you have the right to:

- Be Informed when we are processing your information
- To access and request a copy of the information we hold about you

- To request human intervention where automated decision making or profiling
